Notes from the AKAA Winter Board Meeting

- President Woody Leonard called the meeting to order at 10:11 am Central, February 13, 2014
- Secretary Peter Blaise recapped the email approval of the July 11, 2015 minutes—the minutes were sent to Board members and officers on September 29, 2015; David Spencer motioned to approve, Jeff Jones seconded, and by October 8, 2015, 8 of 15 Board members had voted to approve.
- Treasurer Wade Johnson reported a current treasury balance of \$10,363.38 and noted the balance had declined from last year.
 - Jeff Jones requested Wade provide a table or chart showing account balances over the past several years. Wade agreed to send it out after the Board meeting.
 - Becky Cain recommended the AKAA Reunion Registration Form include an entry for donations to the AKAA operating fund. Jana Calano suggested The Bridge also include a short mention of the need for operating fund donations.
 - Nat Michelson motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report; Jeff Jones seconded; the report was approved by affirmation
- Scholarship Fund Chairperson Fritz Siler reported a current scholarship account balance is \$53,537.50.
 - Scholarship monies are generated through donations and Silent Auction proceeds; Fritz reviewed how the generosity of AKAA alums has boosted the Scholarship Fund.
 - Scholarships have averaged \$2,500 per recipient; usually two scholarships are given each year.
 - Jeff asked about AKAA scholarships being used as a recruitment tool to entice new members to the AKO; Fritz commented that the current AKO requirement for a new member probationary period prohibits using scholarships for recruitment.
 - Nat Michelson suggested a change to the AKO rules to better mesh with using the scholarship fund for recruitment; Shanna Stoker agreed to take his suggestion to the AKO for consideration.
- Shanna Stoker, AKO vocalist and representing Tyler Strickland, reported on the current status of the band.
 - The band has five open slots including lead trumpet, lead trombone, bass, and male vocalist; the current guitarist will also be leaving the band.
 - With the positive growth of the AU Jazz Program, the potential for recruiting new members to the AKO from that program led to some very spirited discussion.
 - Shanna is now the public relations manager for the AKO; more discussion recommended using the weekly AU email blast to all faculty, staff, and students to publicize AKO events as well as greater use of social media.
 - The band requested the AKAA fund replacement stand lights; Peter Blaise stated such minor operating expenses should be the responsibility of the band, not the AKAA.
 - John Norton requested a definition of roles/responsibilities of current band leadership. Shanna recapped that Tyler Strickland is the AKO band manager, Jeremy Leff is the rehearsal coordinator, and agreed to provide more detail subsequent to this meeting.
 - Woody suggested the AKO seek missing charts and new arrangements from known arrangers within the AKAA membership. Shanna was advised to contact Bob Jemian as the AKAA Librarian for missing parts.
 - Board members commented about out-of-date information on the AKO website and recommended the site be updated.
 - Shanna stated the band is pursuing production of a new AKO promotional video; Phil Gipson volunteered to assist the band with staging for the video.
 - John Norton recapped the makeup and purpose of the AKO Board of Directors for Shanna's benefit since she was not aware of that Board's existence.
 - Jeff revisited the topic of recruiting new players to the band; Woody suggested contacting the AU Singers for potential vocalists.
 - Peter Blaise opined that he believes AKO recruitment of new players has stagnated over the past several years. Further, he believes a key strength of the AKO since its inception has been the band's ability to constantly refresh itself from the ranks of AU and other area musicians. Board Members expressed their concerns re: the AKO's longevity if current recruitment problems aren't expediently resolved.
- John Norton reported that since the silent auction began in 2012 to raise scholarship monies; it's been steadily growing. Last year, the auction realized about \$3K for the scholarship fund.
 - The AKAA Scholarship Fund lost a major benefactor last year with Jimmy Newberne's passing.
 - The Scholarship Committee is proposing a springtime golf tournament to raise scholarship monies. John outlined his current planning efforts to date. Sonny Harris motioned to have the Scholarship Committee continue to investigate sponsoring an AKAA Scholarship Golf Tournament; Nat Michelson seconded. If a spring 2016 tournament is viable, Board approval will be subsequently sought via email. The motion was approved by affirmation.

During Lunch, the Board welcomed remarks from Rebecca Estes, Marriott Event Manager; Gretchen VanValkenberg, AU Alumni Affairs/Alumni Association; and Dr. Mike Pendowski, AU Jazz Program.

Dr. Pendowski eloquently updated the Board on the growth of the AU Jazz Program. There are now 65-75 students participating in the Jazz Program and a considerable number are music majors. Currently, there are two bands with space for a third; several combos; and Dr. Pendowski is teaching a Jazz Harmony class. Dr. Pendowski also stated he's receiving good support from the AU Music Department. About seven Knights have been or are currently involved in the Jazz Program. Dr. Pendowski encourages his students to gig as much as they can and that includes playing with the AKO—they only become better players when they have more opportunities to play.

- There will not be a midnight buffet this year. Instead, the Patio Bar menu will be available after the concerts in the Lakeview Room until 11:30 pm.


Notes from the AKAA Winter Board Meeting (continued from Page 2)

- Historian's Report: On Paul McCracken's behalf, Woody Leonard reported that 21 video interviews of Knights alums have been uploaded to YouTube as "Auburn Knights Memories."
- For the AKAA Music Library, progress continues towards full digitization. The Board discussed managing access to the data with Jeff Jones making a motion to investigate saving the Library to the cloud and permitting access for select AKAA officers; David Zuwiyya seconded. Wade Johnson agreed to work the issue with Bob Jemian and Tom Winstead, the motion carried.
- Peter Blaise reported only the November 2015 issue of The Bridge has been published since the July 2015 Board meeting; printing and mailing costs totaled \$364.60.
- Archives Report: Fritz Siler/Becky Cain
 - Fritz and Becky are working to organize the archives, scanning photos, etc.; identifying individuals in photos
 - They need help from all AKAA members in identifying individuals in photos; recapturing locations of past reunions, etc.
 - Fritz requested the next issue of The Bridge encourage attendees to stroll through the archives room and provide any information they can.
- Media Report: Richard Garrett
 - For the past few years, has used Alabama News Network to disseminate reunion info;
 - Tommy Cothran, who's been sitting in with the '30s era band on violin, works for the Alabama Film Commission to facilitate movie production in the state. He works with the Arts Council and will be promoting the Alabama Bicentennial celebration starting this coming summer and running through 2018. Tommy's working on the possibility of bringing a film crew to the 2016 AKAA Reunion to create a 30-minute PBS segment on the Knights.
- AKO Board of Directors Report:
 - Due to Bob Jemian's absence, Woody took the opportunity to discuss how we could further assist the current band.
 - Peter asked if the AKO Board was being used effectively, Phil (also a member of the AKO Board) stated it wasn't.
 - Woody discussed the fine line between the AKAA supporting the current band—something we gladly do—vs. the Alumni trying to run the AKO—something we have historically balked at doing.
 - Woody, with John Norton's assistance, recapped the creation and mission of the AKO Board. Further discussion delved into the need to provide more effective mentoring to the AKO.
 - Woody asked Phil to pass on to the AKO Board that the AKAA expects the AKO Board to be a well-functioning council that provides timely advice and mentoring to the current band.
- AMEA (AKAA Booth) Report: John Norton
 - John recapped this year's AMEA AKAA booth presentation and gave special thanks to Richard Garrett, Woody Leonard, Bob Greenhaw and others for supporting the event.
 - John opined that an AKO recruiting tour held before high school graduations occur could have great potential for recruiting new members to the band.
- 2016 Reunion Update: John Norton
 - No increase in rates for 2017
 - For reservations, call the number previously provided in The Bridge.
- New Business
 - Woody requested nominations to fill the open Board seat resulting from Frank Butenschon's untimely passing. Neal Brumbeloe moved to elect Jim Mahaffey to fill the vacancy; David Zuwiyya seconded. After more discussion, Neal amended his motion to alternately consider Steve Means if Jim Mahaffey declines. The motion carried by affirmation
 - Peter recapped Tom Winstead's proposal to donate original hard copy charts from the AKAA Library to Auburn University Archives; essentially, the AKAA Library would then become solely comprised of digitized charts. Jeff moved that the AKAA move forward with this proposal and investigate contract stipulations from the AU Library re: rights and restrictions to the charts/Jana Calano seconded. The motion carried by affirmation
 - Revision of AKAA Bylaws: Woody addressed revisions to the current AKAA Bylaws re: terms of office for elected positions. Nat moved to accept the changes; Neal seconded. Woody addressed the need for a 20-day notice to the AKAA membership prior to their voting to accept the changes. The motion carried by affirmation
 - Richard Garrett passed on request from AU Alumni Affairs for an updated roster of AKAA membership. Additionally, AU Alumni Affairs would be glad to help disseminate AKAA information to AU alumni.
 - Richard suggested the revised Bylaws address adding the Immediate AKAA Past President as a Board appointee with a two-year appointment.
 - Proposal for Increased Alumni Communications (social media ideas): Jeff Jones discussed the use of Facebook, other social media to promote the Knights; Jeff motioned AKAA created an official AKAA Facebook page and that the costs of running it investigated. Phil Gipson seconded. During discussion, Nat, Fritz, Becky, Jeff volunteered to make it happen. Nat volunteered to be the point person. The motion carried by affirmation
- The meeting adjourned at 2:14 PM Central

Grace Notes

Frank "Boots" Butenschon: AKO Alum Frank "Boots" Butenschon passed away unexpectedly on December 25, 2015 at the age of 77 after a courageous battle with cancer. A fine trumpet player with the Knights from 1958-1960, Boots became a veritable legend in South Georgia for his incredible success in leading the Valdosta High School music program to national prominence. He also enjoyed similar success at high schools in Oxford, Alabama, and Guntersville, Alabama before returning to South Georgia in 1989. A regular attendee at AKAA reunions, Boots had been elected to the AKAA Board of Directors in 2015 and was excited to again play a key role in leading the association.

In 2014, during a reunion of Valdosta High School Marchin' Cats, Boots received a Proclamation from State Representative Tim Golden commemorating his career of excellence in education and music, and was also awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award from Troy State University for his career of service in Musical Educa-



Boots is survived by his wife of 51 years, Susan; son Kevin Butenschon (Kendra); son Chris Butenschon; and five grandchildren,

Walter "Skull" Howell: AKO Alum Walter N. "Skull" Howell, class of 1949, passed away on 9 December 2015 at the age of 87 in Lakeland, FL. After playing tenor sax in the Auburn Knights in the '40s, Walt joined Gene Krupa's big band until family obligations forced him into a different career path with the Department of Defense. After his retirement from civil service, he built a small music business in the Richmond, VA area supporting events, hotels, and restaurants. He thoroughly enjoyed all AKAA reunions and was deeply disappointed when he could no longer travel to the gatherings.

Stephen Mallory Pierce: AKO Alum Mallory Pierce of Birmingham passed away on March 9, 2016 at the age of 90. After WW II service in the Army Air Corps, Mallory attended Auburn where he became a standout trumpet player in the Auburn Knights Orchestra. Graduating with a degree in mechanical engineering, Mallory settled in Birmingham and enjoyed much professional success, eventually starting his own fire protection engineering firm. An active musician and avid supporter of music in Birmingham, Mallory played trumpet in jazz combos, big bands, and, in 1978, became a founding member of the Superjazz Big Band, playing with the group until his retirement from music in 2007.

Mallory is survived by his wife of 60 years, Jean; his sons Stephen Mallory Pierce, Jr. and Adam Prescott Pierce (Stefanie); one grandson, and two great grandchildren.

James "Jimmy" W Newberne, D.V.M., M.Sc., Ph.D.: AKO Alum "Jimmy" Newberne passed away Tuesday, October 20, 2015 at the age of 91. Jimmy achieved great success in his career working in drug research in which he participated in the development of vaccines for measles and polio and also worked on the development of Clomid and Allegra. A Navy pilot during WW II, Jimmy flew the Martin PBM Mariner to provide convoy protection and submarine reconnaissance. After the war, he continued to fly as a flight instructor and a reserve pilot. One of his greatest joys in life was music, with Jazz at the top of the list. While attending Auburn University, he played tenor sax in and led both the Auburn Plainsmen and the Auburn Knights.



Jimmy was preceded in death by his wife of 54 years, Helen; his children James Jr. (Sharon) Newberne, Linda (Bruce) Hilliard, Karen Newberne; three grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.

AKAA Bylaw Revisions

- During the February 13, 2016 meeting of the AKAA Board of Directors, revisions to the AKAA Bylaws were recommended to better align the Bylaws to longtime Board practices. Those recommendations are:
 - Revise the term of office for AKAA elected officers to two years as has long been practiced rather than annually as currently detailed in Article 5, Section 2 of the Bylaws. Another revision is to have the immediate past President continue to serve the Board in the appointed position (non-voting) of Immediate Past President.
 - Revise the description of the Vice President's role to recognize the "... Vice President (or First Vice President in the event there are more than one) shall also serve as the President in Waiting and shall assume the duties of the President when the incumbant's two-year term expires." While AKAA practice has been to elevate the Vice President to the position of President upon completion of the President's two-year term of office, the Bylaws did not reflect that practice.
- These revisions to the Bylaws will be presented to the AKAA general membership during the general membership meeting at 10:00 am, Saturday, July 9, 2016.




Nat Michelson honkin' some mean baritone sax with the '60s era band in 2015.
