It was a cold night in Nashville, about 1957 or '58, and the AKO was playing a gig at the famous Maxwell House Hotel. A well wisher informed the band that it was the best to ever play there and declared an open bar to the guys during the last break.

I was a teetotaler in those days, so me and Harold "Greek" Alexander got one for our cohorts Larry "Lag" Kirkland and Jim "Teeny" Mahaffey. But they had already gotten their snootfuls. We didn't know it until Bob Ware looked up at the trumpets and shouted, "Come on, guys, you sound like you've got cotton in your mouth!"

It was all downhill from there. Teeny and Lag, trying to get the music trunk to Agnes, the bus, fell down the spiral staircase and lay at the bottom laughing uncontrollably. We finally got them up in the back two bunks on Agnes, and Herb Edwards started off through downtown. I was riding shotgun in the well.

Hearing shouts coming from the back of the bus, Herb asked, "What's going on?" I glanced out and saw black smoke bellowing from the bus. Teeny had been shouting, "Fire! Fire!"

Herb shut her down right in the street, and we lit out of there like a covey of quail. A figure passed me with black patent shoes, high black socks, white boxers, a tux shirt, a saxophone in each hand, a clarinet under one arm, and a flute under the other. It was none other than little Dave Edwards flying like the wind!

The folks who topped Agnes off with fuel for us during the gig had set the emergency brake, and it had caught on fire! We put it out and gently nursed Agnes back to Auburn, thus ending another glorious evening on the road with the Auburn Knights!

In January, the Auburn Knights exhibited for the first time at the Alabama Music Educators Conference in Montgomery. Our exhibit was manned by current AK's and alums.

Of the dozens of registrants, there were four graduating seniors who wanted more information. 23 educators were interested in having a program at their school. Many educators were not familiar with the AKO at all.

The AKAA then authorized a mailing to 369 members of the Alabama Bandmaster's Association. It included a new brochure and a flyer for bulletin boards. Later, John Conner (AKO '78) asked for flyers which he handdelivered to two Nashville high schools with great jazz programs.


